This son of Blissfull Hall (winner of the Cane Pace, Little Brown Jug, American-National, Messenger, Champlain, Metro and \$1,468,648 in purses) placed in 44 of 102 career starts. He quickly moved up the ranks at The Meadows as a 3-year-old and had a career mark of 1:52.2f at 6. Blissfull Knight is a great alternative to the high-priced PA stallions and is standing his first season at stud. **STUD FEE: \$1,000**

Self Possessed – Top Bait – Speedy Crown

The alternative to the high-priced PA stallion you've been waiting for is here! Injuries are the only thing that prevented this \$250,000 yearling purchase from being a champion. This royally bred Self Possessed stallion has perfect conformation and raced with a long, flawless gait. In his limited racing career he defeated champion trotter Enough Talk, in a division of the Wyoming Valley Trotting Series at Pocono Downs, while winning two divisions and placing in the series final. KF St Patrick combines early speed, free-for-all longevity and half-mile-track quickness in one sleek package. At 2, he dominated the Ohio Sire Stakes scene, winning nine of 10 starts. At 3, he was honored as Ohio's Horse of the Year, winning the state's Triple Crown, which included a lifetime-best 1:51f score in the Ohio State Fair Stakes at Scioto Downs. At 4, he raced against the best of the free-for-all class, earning \$105,040 and pacing in 1:51.3h at Northfield. He retired with \$405,424 in earnings and is standing his first year at stud in 2010. **Stud Fee: \$1,000**



Hope's Victory

Hope's Victory was a tough competitor on the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes circuit, winning the PA All-Stars and a division of the Keystone Classic at 2, and finishing in the money in the Reynolds, and PA Sire Stakes divisions for 2- and 3-year-olds. He went on to compete successfully in the open ranks, hitting the board 24 times in 33 starts as a 4-year-old, with 16 wins, taking his lifetime mark of 1:54.1f at The Meadows. As a 5-year-old he hit the board in 23 of 29 starts. He continued to take down his competitors at 6 and 7, taking a mark of 1:54.1 at Colonial Downs at 6. **Stud Fee: \$950**
